I have a broad international background from both education and work. To my great advantage my family decided to move to Canada in the summer of 1991 for a period of two years. I attended High School and graduated with an excellent High School Diploma from Aurora High School in the province of Ontario. The years in Canada were a learningful experience personally, as well as socially as I had to learn and make new friends in a secondary language. My skills within the English language were largely acquired during those years. I entered the Danish gymnasium in the second grade and graduated from Virum Gymnasium in 1995.

The school year of 1995 – 1996 was spent at a boarding school in Norway studying outdoors education. In 1997 I spent 7 months in Austria, working as a sales assistant in one of the largest sport-shops in the country.

I have recently spent 5 months in Tasmania, Australia, where I conducted a major research project for the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation, Division of Forestry and Forest Products (CSIRO FFP) and Forestry Tasmania (FT). The project formed part of the requirements for the degree of Bachelor of Forestry. It focussed on the sustainability concept in a broad context, but with emphasis on an analysis of the economic feasibility of various silvicultural systems currently trialed at a site called Warra in Southern Tasmania. During the process an economic model for assessing standing timber value was developed for FT's future assessments at the Warra site.

My interests in outdoor activities like, hunting, fishing, skiing, hiking etc. has played a large role in terms of work and sparetime activities over the past years. I have used my skills within these activities to work as a professional guide in the summer with fishing in Norway (Namsen), Greenland and Canada. In 1998 I completed the second level of telemark ski-instructor at the Norwegian Ski School. These activities all require great judgement, responsibility and good communication skills. These personal qualities may not be directly related to the forestry programme at KVL, but they certainly contribute to success in other fields of work, which I most recently experienced during my stay in Tasmania.

In the summer of 1998 I was offered a contract with a Canadian winter boot manufacturer to distribute their products in Denmark. This was a great opportunity to initiate a personal business, which would provide me with valuable experience and skills that could be beneficial in future work. I distributed their products for 2½ years until I was bound to leave for Tasmania. The establishment of the business required quite an effort as I was studying full time at the same time. I quickly established a good network within the Danish market, and upon my return from Tasmania it was an easy task to get a contract with a German and a Danish company. My work over the last 3 years in this business has given me great experience when it comes to management, planning, sales, presentation, network and last but not least negotiations.

During the fall of 2001 I was given an opportunity to start in The International Woodland Company (IWC) based in Copenhagen Denmark. The ultimate goal for me, throughout my time at KVL, has been the establishment of a network to ease the transition once university is over. The work at IWC is forestry related and focuses on consultancy projects for international customers.

I am a highly focussed, goal-minded, competitive and outgoing person. I love a challenge, and I work hard to reach my objectives.
